For the past nine years, the Childresses have been praying for a little brother for Fallon, and in September, God provided, once again. When the doctor tried to take credit for Colton Mattis, Stephanie promptly reminded him that God had answered their prayers.

Fallon has been praying for a brother. He didn't want a sister because 'girls tell all our secrets.' So he prayed, and when Stephanie found out she was pregnant, she teased Colton, telling him he would have a little baby sister. "Then I told him, 'No, really, you will have a baby brother.' He was so excited, jumping up and down, anxious to tell his friends, and the look on his face was pure joy."

Stephanie continued, "It was very depressing, not being able to have another child so that Fallon could have a sibling, perhaps someday be an uncle." Stephanie has now healed from a C-section delivery, with strict warnings from her doctor not to have another child. But as Stephanie has said, "It is entirely up to God."

Karen says, “When Sue approached me about taking over in the Clothing Department for Stephanie, I was unsure whether I should take on this role. Stephanie worked several hours a day, 6 days a week and I knew I would not be able to dedicate as much time as she did. I prayed about it and later told Sue that I would do my best to take on this role and try to make the Department run smoothly. Thanks to the wonderful volunteers in the Clothing Department we have been able to provide clothes and shoes to our clients. All of the hard work we put in is worth it when I see the smiles on the clients faces as they fill their baskets with much needed clothing for their family. I was very nervous about switching the store over from summer to fall as I knew this was a huge endeavor. The Clothing volunteers, as well as volunteers from other departments, plus ten ladies from Piney Forest Seventh Day Adventist Church (near Danville) showed up to help out and within a few hours, the job was completed. Thank you to all who helped.”

## Calling All Crocheters! Create Cozy Christmas Covers for Kids

Volunteers are needed to make over 1300 blankets for Agape kids! Donna Cosmato, an Agape volunteer, came up with the idea of providing every child a blanket in their Christmas basket from Agape. She is recruiting volunteers to help in the crocheting, organizing the materials, and has solicited donations to fund the project. Most of the yarn is donated to Agape, but the fleece blankets must be purchased.

“Creating Cozy Christmas Covers for Kids” provides colorful crocheted borders on blankets to be included in a Christmas basket for each of the children of Agape clients. Yarn and blankets are provided – you just do the work. If you are unable to crochet, help is needed to sort and weigh yarn, fold fleece, and make packets for those who will crochet the borders.

Donna Cosmato, says, “We especially need yarn donations, including partial skeins. All financial donations will be used to purchase supplies that are not donated. Some corporate financial sponsors to date include Rocky Mount Walmart, Bonsack Walmart, and the Radford Baptist Church Women’s Missionary Union. The project has also been funded by generous community citizens. Over fifteen volunteers from area churches and the community are already hard at work creating these unique Christmas gifts, but there is always room for more.”

Donna and her 85 year-old mother, Kate Schubert, of Carmel, Indiana, have been making various crocheted items for Agape clients for several years. Kate says, “I’m glad I got to be here for this project! I came to this area for medical care, and while I’m rehabilitating, I get to crochet with my daughter and wonderful women-friends, and women I’ve just met. I’m just thankful that I can do something useful. I get pleasure doing it for God and for the kids who will receive the blankets.”

The volunteers are praying over each blanket, for the child who will re-

The process starts with the kit (left) —a fleece blanket, matching yarn for the border, a crochet hook, and instructions, all packaged into a tote bag. Next, one of our volunteers, in this case Kate Schumaker (center), crochets a border around the blanket. Then, the blanket (right) is matched with age/sex-appropriate toys, puzzles, or stuffed animals, wrapped in a cellophane bag, tied with a big bow, and is ready for distribution.
